South Hills Announces Winter 2018-19 Dean's List









South Hills strives to involve the PAC members in the school as much as possible by inviting them to capstone project presentations, asking them to serve as guest speakers in our classes and also inviting them to conduct mock interviews with our students.

Susan has worked in education and academics at South Hills since 1990. She was a Program Coordinator, Internship Coordinator, and Instructor in the Business Administration—Management &




Marketing program until she transitioned into her role in administration at South Hills in 2011.
